Expanding the H & I Committee in Your Area or District

"If You Build, They Will Come"

Two trains of thought may paralyze us in regards to enlarging the number of our H&I meetings. The first: "We want to expand our number of meetings, but we don't have enough people to chair them." The second: "We want people to get involved with H & I, but there is no room - we don't have enough meetings." This "Catch 22" may create a seemingly unsolvable problem when trying to expand your H & I Committee.

There Is a Solution

Enough about the problem, what's the solution? One solution we have found is working from the philosophy of "If you build it, they will come". This means we start the H & I meeting first, then work at trying to get people to do it. This means YOU may have to do SEVERAL meetings until you recruit people to take them over. Consequently, for a while at least it may seem like you have no life!

We Get Results!

In one District, applying this philosophy resulted in an increase from 7 to 47 H & I meetings in three years; they now carry our message to over 8000 still suffering addicts each year. Many of these addicts are now in turn on the H & I Committee themselves - carrying the message to still more addicts. Thus we grow! One result of this growth has been the corresponding increase in the size of CA itself in this District.

Finding the People

In the District described above, except where the facility desires otherwise, the sobriety requirement to do an H & I meeting is 90 days. If Bill W. had waited until he was a year sober to start working with others; C.A. probably would not exist, you probably wouldn't be reading this, and we probably wouldn't have written it. By doing it this way, we make good use of the enthusiasm of the "90 Day Wonder" type, and vastly increase his or her chance of staying sober in the process. "...nothing will so much insure immunity from drinking or using as intensive work with other alcoholics or addicts."*

It May Not Be Easy

Expanding your H & I in the manner we are describing may not be easy, but the rewards are endless. Bill W. said it best - "Life will take on a new meaning. To watch people recover, to see them help others, to watch loneliness vanish, to see a fellowship grow up about you, to have a host of friends - this is an experience you must not miss. We know you will not want to miss it."*

Your World Service Board of Trustees has suggested that this Conference approved Statement of Policy be reprinted periodically in the NewsGram.

In keeping with both the 12 Traditions as well as the spirit of service work in Cocaine Anonymous it appears appropriate for CA members involved in service to be careful in their dealings with outside vendors, businesses and/or services. Specifically quite often what is service work to the CA member is business (i.e. money) to the business being dealt with. Consequently, the business may provide, or at least attempt to provide, certain "perks" (i. e. benefits, gifts, etc.) to the CA member or members responsible for the decision(s) as to who to use or buy from for the particular CA event/activity. What is important here is that the fellowship receives the benefit of impartial decisions based upon what is best for the fellowship. Whenever a decision maker is the recipient of "outside benefits: There is always the possibility that his or her judgement may be affected. Moreover, even when the receipt of such benefits does not in fact influence the CA member, it nevertheless gives the appearance to others, both inside or outside the fellowship. Such an appearance can only lead to unnecessary controversy and such as discounts, travel expenses, free hotel rooms, etc. are standard benefits of doing business with the

In light of the above, it seems only appropriate that members in service agree with and acknowledge the within Statement of Policy.

Step Corner 1, 2, 3

Step Four: Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

I don't have room in this issue to thoroughly cover the 4th step inventory, although I wish I did. It is such an important step. The main thing to remember is that the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous outlines specific instructions on how to do a 4th step inventory. Those instructions are found in Chapter Five, pages 63 through 71.

Immediately after the third step in the Big Book, it says "Next, we launched out on a course of vigorous action, The First Step of which is a

personal housecleaning."

Many people are intimidated, or afraid of this step because of the amount of work there is to do. Many people do not want to take a look at themselves, and their behavior. This step is the first of the "action" steps. The first step that requires us to do physical, concrete, tangible work. It

is the first step which necessitates putting the pen to paper. I have found that most people spend more energy talking about it, worrying about it, or circumventing it than they do actually completing it.

My experience in doing this step was at first uncomfortable. You see, I don't like to look at myself, I'd rather look at you, and what it is that you're doing wrong. This is where I am spiritually sick. But once I realized MY part in all of these resentments, fears and sex conducts, that it was I who was to blame for my behavior and my reactions to people, I began to grasp what this program is all about.

I realized that this program is not about ME! It is about US! I must learn to keep my own house in order, and carry the message of recovery to other addicts. Anyone who says this is a selfish program, better read their Big Books a little more often. True, we are SELFISH people by nature, but as a result of working the steps, we become SELF-LESS. If I am thinking about myself instead of what I can do for others, I know I am operating in self. That is how I keep myself in check. I

learned that from the fourth column of my inventory. Every single time I looked at my part, it was because I was being selfish or self centered, dishonest or afraid. I learned in this step that the world does not revolve around me, although for years, I would swear it did. There is a bigger picture for all of us. We are simply "actors in the play of life."

It was said in the 60's that "if you are not part of the solution, then you are part of the problem" That holds true in the Fellowship that surrounds us. If we are into the solutions, then we will not be focusing on what's wrong in our lives and with other people, we will be looking towards

We, as recovering addicts are part of the solution. We are living our lives clean and sober, learning new behaviors, learning to live honestly, and with integrity. That in itself is a contribution to our society. This "housecleaning" step is the beginning of that voyage.

Stories from the fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous (The CA Storybook)

Over five years ago, the Fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous expressed a desire for a Cocaine Anonymous, Conference Approved book - of our own. Committees were formed, stories were solicited, and the work began. In January, 1992, someone passed a basket around to help the World Service Office fund the printing of the book. Soon, donations began pouring in! We created flyers, and donations continued to flood the World Service Office. The "Storybook Publishing Fund" was established, and a goal was set for \$25,000.00. After many years of painstaking, struggling hours of exertion, countless deadlines, a few delays, and a lot of love, the Storybook, now titled "Hope, Faith & Courage: Stories From the Fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous" went to the press December, 1993. The total amount donated, as of the printing of this issue, is \$23,626.18. And, As of December, the WSO pre-sold 6,723 books!

For a long time now, I have wanted to say: Get out of my life-goodbye-stay away! You have taken so much, I bid you farewell, You're not worth the pain of going through hell.

So again I must say: Cocaine, I'm talking to you, Again for today, I bid you adieu.
