## "FROM LITTLE ACORNS DO MIGHTY OAKS GROW" THE LONDON AREA BY: Nicholas L.

London, England, UK

It was 1994 and I had been sober just about two years hanging out in A.A. I had never heard of Cocaine Anonymous in my life. Life was tricky and I was told not to share about drugs in A.A. and I found N.A., but that was not really my sort of people. Something needed to change. As chance happened (odd or God) I decided to share from the heart and it just happened. I launched into a drugalog to the horror of the members of that group; some walked out, some muttered, but no one told me to stop and I brought my share to a close. One lady however made a beeline straight for me and said you must come and share tomorrow in C.A. – it begins.

I walked into the meeting and to my astonishment when I looked up I saw some pals. "What took you so long," "where you been." I spoke and they spoke back. I was home. These were my folk. This was my home. I had finally arrived. The Big Book of *Alcoholics Anonymous* was already one of my tools. I loved the C.A. literature like it was written for me, about me – my life took on new meaning.

I made that meeting my home group. I soon knew most people (there was only six meetings in Europe at that time — all in London. I served, I made tea, I ranted, I dated, I got dumped, I grew..... God was in my life and we were on the march. I was a secretary, a GSR and met others and went to the UK Area meetings I felt part of most days. Meetings grew, groups split off (out of resentments, geography, helpline suggestions.) We had no delegates then one member went to a convention in the US — we were inspired, Americans started turning up — it was awesome indeed. One of these men is my sponsor today.

We grew and we grew, small conventions to start with then bigger. Districts were formed. I became a delegate and went to the World Service Conference. I got married. Things were still on the move. I did London District service and at one point was humbled to be asked to chair it (I had experience from CAUK.) I then became a World Service Trustee – I helped C.A. grow as much as I could and then I rotated out. The C.A. World Convention was held in Birmingham UK and was a fantastic event.

I stepped back, got divorced and kept moving. I chose to sit at the back, shared less and let others shine - CAUK kept growing. I went back to London District over an amends I owed, I was forgiven and we all moved on. Meanwhile, CAUK was over 320 meetings strong and London District edged towards 90 meetings. It was too much, people were not being heard, I heard of resentments, frustrations etc. Who would be brave enough to propose a London Area? Someone (not me) stepped up a steering group went and worked out how we might proceed.

The day came when we all met up (a few old timers were there too) and debate ensued. Members were hesitant and I smelled some fear in the room. I stood up and made a pitch "if not now when?" I spoke of all my experience and was almost tearful in my gratitude for what courage God had given me to overcome my fears. Another stood up and back up the same sentiment. This was a day to make history. I left them to it (I had no vote). The next day I received an email – they had gone and done it – the birth of a new Area, My heart soared. Never doubt God's plans – he has it all covered!

#### ESTABLISHING A C.A. AREA OR DISTRICT ARCHIVES

"Protecting C.A.'s Future By Preserving C.A.'s Legacy"

The purpose of the C.A. AREA OR DISTRICT archives ought to document permanently the work of Cocaine Anonymous in your Area or District and make the history of the organization accessible to C.A. members and to provide a context for understanding C.A.'s progression, principles and traditions.

The mission of the C.A. Area or District Archive Committee is to collect, protect and preserve, organize, catalogue and present historically valued documents, printed materials, items, artifacts, ephemera and memorabilia of Cocaine Anonymous in your Area or District into two archival collections:

- 1. C.A. AREA OR DISTRICT General History
- a. Minutes, Meeting Lists, policies and procedures, etc.
  - 2. C.A. AREA OR DISTRICT Convention and Event History
- a. Minutes, Committee Reports, Flyers, Banners, Speaker Recordings, etc.

The history of the founding of the Fellowship in your Area or District is a vital and informative resource. We need always acknowledge our background in order to secure our collective future. Historic records help us to sift through our day-to-day experience in recovery and reach back for the shared experience of the past. Sorting the myth from the facts we can ensure that our original message of recovery, unity and service remains the same in a changing, growing, expanding Fellowship.

A C.A. Area or District Archives initiative may take years, even decades, to achieve, but they are worth striving for. Establishing a committee composed of C.A. Area or District members, and asking for their advice and assistance with archival decisions, will encourage C.A. Member interest in the archives. An Archival Committee will help develop policy and procedural decisions, and help raise awareness about the archives in the C.A. Area or District.

The C.A. Area or District Area Archives Chairperson ought to be responsible to form an Archives Committee responsible for documenting the work of C.A., including making the history of the C.A. in the Area or District accessible to C.A. members and to provide a context for understanding C.A.'s progression, principles and traditions.


The C.A. Area or District Archives Committee ought to be responsible for establishing policies, budgets, and procedures. It undertakes and maintains final responsibility and authority for the use of the archives, and exercises its group conscience in regard to matters of general policy. In all of its actions, the C.A. Area or District Archives Committee needs to be mindful of and guided by C.A.'s primary purpose.

It is helpful for the Archives Committee to meet on a regular basis to aid the C.A. Area or District Archivist and to become familiar with the maintenance of the collection.

The C.A. Area or District Archives Committee ought to maintain records of permanent value to allow any member to go back and consult the original sources again and again.



#### ULTIMATE AUTHORITY BY: Tom P.

"For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern (C.A. Tradition Two). Addicts who have experienced the miracle of recovery have, at some time in the progression of their transformation, come to rely upon a Power greater than themselves. In the course of that contact, life takes on a new form. No longer self-reliant, the spiritual tool of God-reliance becomes readily available. As I rely on my Higher Power, the events of my life become joyous, useful, and meaningful. The same concept occurs for a group. Each group is different from the others. Members of the group have different life experiences and different cultural views. Yet each group has to come to the same realization—in order for it to survive, the ultimate authority must be a Power greater than the group. Simply stated, this Power expresses itself through the group conscience. An effective group conscience is one that has been informed by its members' collective experience and wisdom. Over time, a group will find that the group conscience is far more reliable than the direction of an individual member. The group will come to rely on it" (excerpt from A Quiet Peace, Daily Meditations from the Fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous, February 15).

Last night being the last Sunday of the month for February, our "Not In Vein" C.A. 12 and 12 bookstudy meeting read and discussed Tradition Two. As is typically the case in this meeting I was drawn inwardly to reflect on my experience with this Tradition and the Fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous. I can see how much this tradition has served to facilitate the internal softening/transformation necessary for me to live in the Tenth Step promise of "ceased fighting anything or anyone." Staying conscious of the fact that God is working and informing the conscience of every member who has made and continues to make the surrendered effort to live by these principles, awakens me to the truth that I don't have all the answers. The perspective of others enters my heart and brings me closer to each member and in so doing allows me to feel the closeness of my Creator. I have witnessed the group conscience process bring tears and laughter in the same debate, but always the ultimate authority expresses itself when the group is open to that experience. When these experiences occur, and in my experience they are frequent, a connection is made between those involved that is strong and deep. This commitment to work together is not something that is generated by an ego-driven desire, instead, the member ". . . feels a spiritual and ethical compulsion, because hundreds may be suffering within reach of his help" (Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, page 133). Always being reminded of our primary purpose by regularly working with suffering addicts who have not yet found this solution is one of the benefits of regular attendance at meetings and C.A. functions and Tradition Two reminds me that I am not God.

### A VIEW OF C.A.'S TWELVE CONCEPTS OF SERVICE CONCEPT TWO

While the "power of the groups and members to alter their world service structure and to criticize its operation is virtually supreme." (*Twelve Concepts for World Service* by Bill W. pg. 10) it is probably clear to any member of our Fellowship that they, as a group of groups, cannot effectively manage our world services.

So during the first three World Service Conferences, the Fellowship formally delegated the complete authority for the active maintenance of our world services to the World Service Conference. The result is Concept Two which spells out the granting of the authority as follows:

"The C.A. Groups delegate to the World Service Conference the complete authority for the active maintenance of our world services and thereby make the Conference — excepting for any change in the Twelve Traditions — the actual voice and the effective conscience for our whole Fellowship." (CAWS World Service Manual 2016 Edition pg. 8).

As I discussed in a previous article about Concept One, the structure of our World Services is all about ultimate and more importantly delegated authority. In the beginning of Cocaine Anonymous there were many groups that formally established themselves as legal entities. A group of individuals in Los Angeles formed Cocaine Anonymous World Services to operate World Services in 1984. That authority came from the Founders and old timers of Cocaine Anonymous in its infancy. Frankly, it was also a bit about taking the power before someone else did. Remember, it was only a couple of years since the first meeting that the World Services legal entity came into being.

In 1985 our Trustees were in name only (and not well known), Cocaine Anonymous World Services (incorporated) membership was exclusively from Los Angeles; our service structure was loose to say the least. There was confusion and worry as to how Cocaine Anonymous was to survive let alone function smoothly,

Born out of this confusion, the Founders and members of Cocaine Anonymous World Services held meetings starting in September 1985 for the purpose of holding the first World Service Conference. A committee was formed to outline how the business conference of Cocaine Anonymous was to run.

In February 1986 the first business conference was held and effectively did exactly what Concept Two allowed without it even being in force. However, the transfer of authority did not take place at that meeting. A lot was accomplished but primarily it was to establish the process of handing off the authority of the Founders to the World Service Conference

In July 1986 the Conference (known then as the "Cocaine Anonymous Business Conference", (minutes of meetings July 2,3 1986 in San Diego, CA) heard reports and voted on a temporary service structure. Of import at this meeting was the recognition that the Fellowship as a whole as having the authority for the operations of world services. In fact, "Any business that did not go out to the Fellowship can only be voted on at this Conference as temporary. It must go back to the Fellowship for their approval. This is the only way the Fellowship's voice can be heard, as was discussed at the last conference." (ibid) More reports were heard and a temporary service structure was formed including a formal recognition of a Board of Trustees. For the first time Trustee members were named and voted upon.

At the third World Service Conference in March 1987 the C.A. Twelve Concepts of service were, after much debate (about 30 pages of minutes), adopted, unanimously.

It was also during this Conference that it adopted the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Cocaine Anonymous, adopting guidelines and procedures, accepting bids for Conventions among many other actions taken. In other words, the process of the Fellowship delegating its authority for the active maintenance of World Services, took nearly 18 months and three conferences to just get to this point.

The reason for this discussion is to note that Concept Two was born in A.A. out of similar circumstances. The result, Concept Two, is the process of getting there if you will. The fact is that the growth of Cocaine Anonymous in its first two years demanded more than a handful of Founders could provide. More and more of the operational authority of World Services were handed to the board of directors of newly incorporated Cocaine Anonymous World Services, and other volunteer. Those directors were

selected and voted into office by the existing directors. The Fellowship as a whole did not take part in that. In other words, the same problem facing A.A. now confronted C.A. in the middle 80's.

Our solution was similar to A.A.'s. Get the authority into the hands of the Fellowship which would in turn hand off delegated authority to other bodies that are also outlined in our Concepts (more on those later). Then, as a result of the process of Concept Two, the active service conscience of Cocaine Anonymous now resides in the hands of its World Service Conference as delegated to it by the Fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous. It is to the World Service Conference that the Fellowship turns to when questions arise on matters affecting Cocaine Anonymous as a whole.

In the month of December – We added a much needed extension to the existing Archives Room – allowing Archives to continue to grow and be stored safely within our office. We are now able to store odd shaped items as well as posters and graphs in its own area instead of under tables or areas where they must constantly be moved. In fact we are so excited that you can actually spin in circles down the aisle without falling over stuff!

Another improvement is that we have partitioned off a small Equipment Area. This improvement keeps the equipment running safely at a warmer temperature and not interfering with the cooler storage temperature of the C.A. Archives.

A special thanks for all your hard work to Randy M, Norma Jean, Henry A, and Scott S. – they have once again sorted all the boxes by number and made it more manageable to continue cataloging items for our Archival Database. This is one *Rockin' and Archivin' Committee!* 

Once the new extension for the Archives area was completed the WSO invested in some new Pallet Racks and we are now able to stack pallets of books two high as well as storage on the third level for items used just once (or twice) a year. Yep, we are moving on up to the big times!

We knew we needed to reorganize – so we took 3 days to take everything out of the warehouse, move it to the front office to make it possible to move and rearrange the shelving in the back. 




